It is diagnosed in families that have more than one member with AD (usually multiple persons in more than one generation) in which the age of onset is consistently before age 60 and often between the ages of 30 and 60 years.

For example, some heart and blood circulation problems, stroke, and diabetes are more common in people who have Alzheimer ' s than in the general population. Diseases caused by infections also are common.

A healthy, balanced diet may reduce your risk of dementia, as well as other conditions including cancer, type 2 diabetes, obesity, stroke and heart disease. Eat a balanced diet. Eat at least five portions of fruit and vegetables a day. Eat protein (such as oily fish, beans, pulses, eggs or meat) at least twice a week.

They can also help diagnose other causes of memory problems, such as stroke, tumor, Parkinson ' s disease, sleep disturbances, side effects of medication, an infection, mild cognitive impairment, or a non-Alzheimer ' s dementia, including vascular dementia. Some of these conditions may be treatable and possibly reversible.

Alzheimer ' s disease is a life-limiting illness, although many people diagnosed with the condition will die from another cause. As Alzheimer ' s disease is a progressive neurological condition, it can cause problems with swallowing. This can lead to aspiration (food being inhaled into the lungs), which can cause frequent chest infections.

The combination we have affects our risk of Alzheimer ' s disease, as follows: APOE e4 is associated with a higher risk of Alzheimer ' s disease. About 25 per cent of the general population inherits one copy of APOE e4. This increases their lifetime risk of developing Alzheimer ' s disease by a little more than two times, on average.

In the later stages of Alzheimer ' s disease, the symptoms become increasingly severe and can be distressing for the person with the condition, as well as their carers, friends and family.
