A combination of the following causes result in landslides: (1) Slow erosion caused by alternate freezing and thawing water, and wind action gradually wears away supporting materials, (2) Water after heavy rains affect marginally stable slopes, by liquefying the materials. (3) Advancing glaciers often displace supporting material along the valley walls, and, consequently, the slopes above are robbed of their ice-support.

Economic losses from all disaster events ◌ both natural and man-made catastrophes ◌ were USD 337 billion last year. Natural catastrophe-related economic losses made up of the bulk of these losses, at around USD 330 billion in 2017, coming mostly from hurricanes, severe storms, wildfires, floods and other weather events in North America, the Caribbean and Europe.

The man made environmental disasters on the ring of islands began in 1946 when the U.S. began testing nuclear weapons there. Twenty-three devices were exploded between 1946 and 1958 on and around the islands. As a result, 167 Marshallese residents of the islands were forced to relocate.
