Intimate Partner Violence in LGBTQ communities Spotting LGBTQ+ Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Domestic violence occurs at the same rate in same-sex relationships as it does heterosexual relationships. But because of unique issues within the LGBTQ community, like mistrust with law enforcement, being unwillingly [outed](#) and misunderstanding of what domestic violence can look like (verbal abuse, financial control, mental control, etc.), many LGBTQ people and law enforcement may not realize what an abusive relationship looks like.

This report provides an overview of existing research on intimate partner violence (IPV) and sexual abuse (IPSA) among lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people and makes recommendations for future research. We reviewed 42 studies, from 1989 to the present, that include findings on the prevalence of IPV and IPSA, survivors' barriers to seeking help, and the quality of available assistance for LGBT people.

Intimate partner violence describes physical violence, sexual violence, stalking, or psychological harm by a current or former partner or spouse. This type of violence can occur among LGBTQ and non-

LGBTQ INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE AND COVID-19 Donovan & Hester (2011) instead argue that heteronormative understandings of domestic abuse can still be applied to LGBTQ relationships i.e. mutually violent control, common couple violence, intimate terrorism and violent resistance (Johnson, 2006), although the abuse should be looked at through an intersectional lens.

Power and Control: Domestic and Intimate-Partner Violence ... While the dynamics of intimate partner violence in LGBTQ relationships are the same as those in heterosexual relationships, homophobia, heterosexism and transphobia offer unique tactics abusers can use and create extra barriers for victims/survivors.
