Extraction Techniques | Maceration Percolation Infusion ...
The infusion and the glycolic extracts are for external use. Tinctures, mother tinctures, and macerated glycerides, rather, are for both external and internal uses. It is recommended to mix the plant inside the container at least once a day for the entire time of maceration to make sure that the solvent penetrates all of the plant material.

Maceration and percolation are extraction methods. Maceration involves soaking or steeping. On the other hand, percolation involves filtration through a porous material. Therefore, this is the key difference between maceration and percolation. Both methods facilitate the extraction of desired substances from a mixture.

Natural medicines were the only option for the prevention and treatment of human diseases for thousands of years. Natural products are important sources for drug development. The amounts of bioactive natural products in natural medicines are always fairly low. Today, it is very crucial to develop effective and selective methods for the extraction and isolation of those bioactive natural products.

Techniques for extraction and isolation of natural ...
In percolation process there are 3 main stages. a. Imbibition : The powdered drug is moistened with some of the menstrum and allowed to stand for 4 hours. During this time the drug swells and the menstrum penetrates the cell walls. b. Maceration :- The moistened drug is left in contact with the menstrum for 24 hours. During this time the menstrum is saturated with the soluble constituents of drug.

Extraction procedures: There are several procedures for extraction: e.g maceration, percolation, digestion, infusion, decoction, digestion etc. Most pharmacopoeias generally refer to maceration and percolation for the extraction of active principles from crude drugs. The general techniques of medicinal plant extraction include maceration, infusion, percolation, digestion, decoction, hot continuous extraction (Soxhlet), aqueous-alcoholic extraction by fermentation, counter current extraction, microwave-assisted extraction, ultrasound extraction (sonication), supercritical fluid extraction, and distillation techniques (water distillation, steam distillation, phytionic extraction (with hydro fluorocarbon solvents).

Extraction Methods for Preparation of Bioactive Plant Extracts
Percolation tinctures are made by grinding a dried herb, moistening it with some of the solvent, then letting it sit for 12-24 hours to moisten and expand. It is then packed into a cone (not too gently, or too hard) and the rest of the solvent (alcohol/water) is poured over the top of the herb.
