Balboursa then, as now, was not terribly well-known, though the geographer Strabo (13.4.167 C631) writing in the late 1 st century BCE described it as once belonging to a tetrapolis along with Oinoanda, Bubon and Kibyra, also attesting four languages in the area: Pisidian, Greek, Solyimian and Lydian. The reasons for conducting the survey, as well as the techniques used and the research questions addressed, have now been outlined in full by J.J. Coulton, the project director (Coulton 2012).
