Written by an author who rose from military officer to administration insider, this is a vivid, unvarnished view of America ' s fight against Communism, from the end of WWII to the closing of the Strategic Air Command, a work as full of human interest as history, rich characters as bloody conflict. From Eisenhower ' s decision to beat the Russians at their own game, to the " Missile Gap " of the Kennedy Era, to Reagan ' s vow to "lean on the Soviets until they go broke "—all the pivotal events of the period are portrayed in new and stunning detail with information only someone on the front lines and in backrooms could know. Yet At the Abyss is more than a riveting and comprehensive recounting. It is a cautionary tale for our time, a revelation of how, " those years . . . came to be known as the Cold War, not World War III."

Films, novels, museums and memorials are used alongside more traditional sources, allowing exploration of history and memory .And whilst the importance of comparison underpins this book, it also provides a detailed history of many neglected refugee movements or aspects within them such as gender and childhood.
